

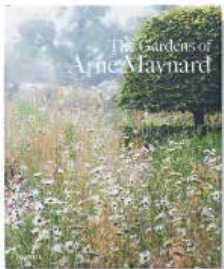
GRAND TOUR

1 | THE GARDENS OF ARNE MAYNARD, Arne Maynard, £45, Merrell. Celebrated garden designer and RHS Chelsea Flower Show gold medallist Arne Maynard has chosen 12 projects to tell the story of his work. Details of his design methods and plant selections, as well as atmospheric photography by his partner William Collinson, show how Arne creates the harmonious, soulful gardens he is known for. Illustrated features on kitchen gardens, growing roses and planting borders complete the text.



2 | THE THRIFTY FORAGER, Alys Fowler, £16.99, Kyle Books. In *The Thrifty Forager*, Alys Fowler is your enthusiastic field guide to becoming a 21st-century hunter-gatherer. Where some see weeds, Alys sees supper, and soon, so will you, whether you live in the country or the city. You will learn what to pick and when, where you can and can't forage, how to recognise plants and which bits taste best. The most important part is the eating and Alys also shares her favourite recipes using foraged ingredients.



3 | GARDEN DESIGN SOLUTIONS, Stephen Woodhams, £25, Jacqui Small. Whether you have a roof terrace, cottage garden or urban courtyard, Stephen Woodhams can help you make the most of your outdoor space. The award-winning designer has spent 25 years creating gardens around the world, with his trademark architectural style and lush, elegant planting. Alongside inspirational projects are practical advice for layout and planting, and ideas for furnishings, focal points and colour schemes.
